The Texas Association of Secondary School Principals promotes a statewide legislative platform that places students in the forefront of the educational process by empowering school leaders to:

Ensure a Safe and Secure Environment for all Students and Staff

- Schools are provided with equitable resources and funding needed to maintain a safe and secure environment.
- Schools are provided measures that promote student and staff mental health as a critical component of improving school climate, safety, and learning and provide school personnel with best practices for dealing with social and emotional needs.

Ensure a Quality and Equitable Education for all Students

- All students are provided with an education that prepares them to be college, career, or military ready.
- All students engage in authentic and relevant learning experiences in a healthy, safe, and responsive environment.
- All students are prepared to become lifelong learners and productive citizens.

Address Educator Preparation, Shortages, and Retention

- Teacher preparation programs are research-based, relevant, and promote best practices to meet the needs of the whole child.
- Educators are provided with sustained on-the-job training and/or coaching/mentoring to promote growth.
- Incentives, compensation, and health benefits are provided to address educator shortages and promote educator retention.

Support Sustainable and Equitable Funding for Public Education

- The current academic, behavioral, social, and emotional needs of individual students are considered in determining equitable school funding.
- Local school districts are supported with state funding that ensures the implementation and sustainability of legislation.

Support Authentic Accountability for Students and Schools

• School accountability systems that look beyond high-stakes standardized testing.

Due to the neither the House, or Senate scheduling an education related committee meeting during the month of November at the Capitol, the committee met to develop the TASSP State-Wide Legislative Platform. On November 28 & 29, 2022, Alison Smith, Chair of the TASSP Legislative Committee, facilitated the review and revision process for formulating the TASSP State-wide Legislative Platform. At the TASSP Summer Workshop and at the spring 2023 regional meetings throughout the state, TASSP will be giving updates from the legislative session.
