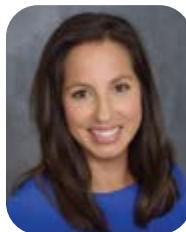

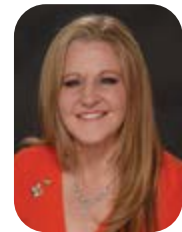

Recording CPE Hours

The Texas Association of Secondary School Principals approved provider number is 500-111. TASSP does not keep a copy of attendance by session at TASSP-sponsored workshops and conferences. On the TASSP Event App, there is a CPE form that attendees can use to record attendance by session, title, CPE Standards, and time. Jonathan Alsheimer - Grand Opening General Session • Tue. 8:00a

Taking Leadership to the Next Level

The thermometer reads what is going on, how the students interact, what the parents say, and how the building/classroom flows. The Thermostat transforms what is going on, sets expectations, continues adjusting for student interactions, informs parents of what is going on, and initiates actions to set the culture of the building or classroom. Ask yourself, are you the THERMOSTAT or the THERMOMETER? If you are ready to be the thermostat, Dr. Young will inspire you with stories and action steps to help you BE THE THERMOSTAT in your classrooms and school.

Taking Charge Versus Taking Care: Examining Effective Leadership through Gender Dimensions for Women in Leadership

This session will examine leadership behaviors through the lens of gender dimensions and empower participants to reflect upon their own styles to determine strategies for overcoming potential gender stereotype bias in their leadership role.

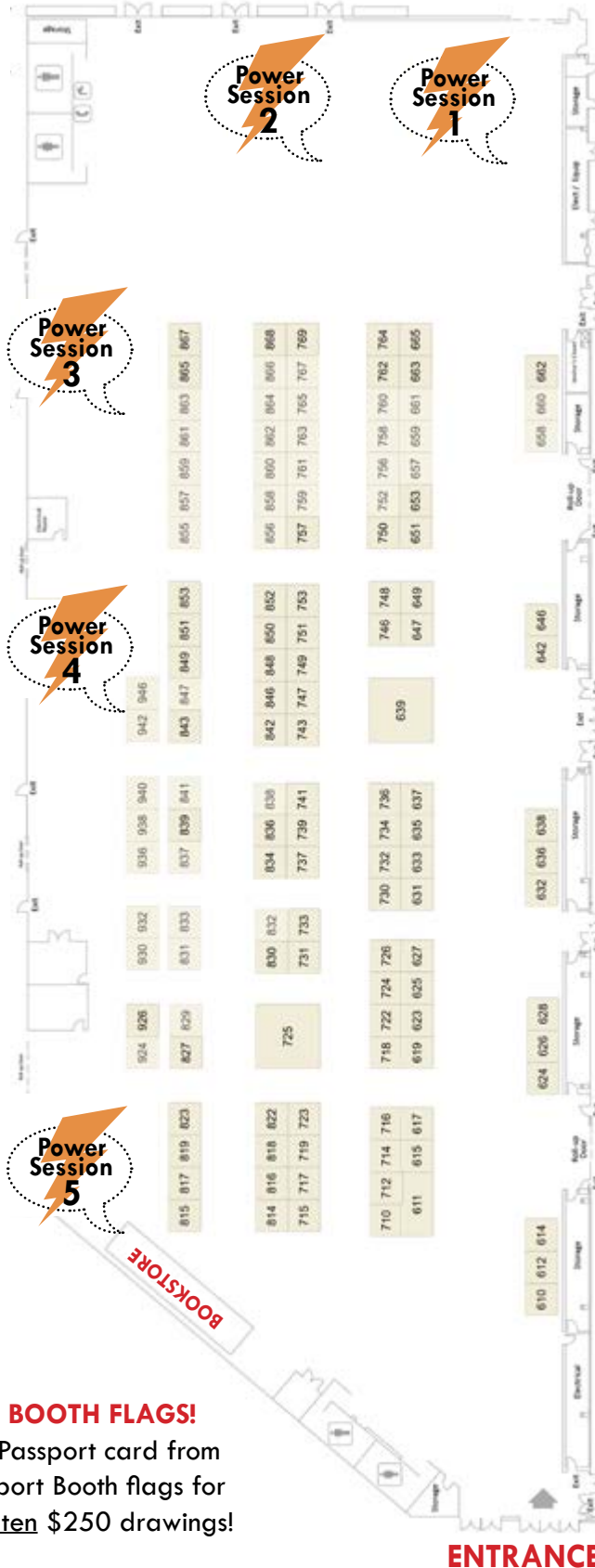

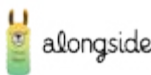

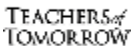
